



Ingibjörgu Hjaltadóttur, RN, CNS, PhD

Ingibjörg Hjaltadóttir finished her B.S. degree in nursing in 1983 and M.S. degree in 2001 from the University of Iceland and in 2012 a PhD degree in health sciences at the University of Lund in Sweden. Her doctoral research is on: Quality of Care, Residents' Functioning, Disabilities and Survival in Nursing Homes. She is currently an associate professor in nursing at the Faculty of Nursing at the University of Iceland and a Clinical Nurse Specialist at the Emergency, Geriatrics, Rehabilitation Services at the National University Hospital, Reykjavik, Iceland. Her field of work has been in geriatric nursing since 1985 and has been doing research in the field of geriatric nursing and in multidisciplinary research in geriatrics since 1988. She has been working on various projects concerning geriatric service's for the Ministry of Welfare and the Directorate of Health since 1993. She has done both quantitative and qualitative research. Some of the topics of her research have been: Quality of life in nursing homes; staffing models in geriatric nursing; quality of care in geriatric nursing; development of a screening tool for nutritional status for old people in hospital; animal assisted therapy for patients with dementia; standards of care for nursing homes. She has also been in research collaboration using the Resident Assessment Instrument i.e. in nursing homes, palliative care and home care as well as involved in research collaboration with the RAI instruments in the Nordic countries.
